
We are well into Autumn and have just had a fantastic Easter weekend. The weather was outstanding, and the course was busy with locals and visitors alike, all enjoying the experience.

Where is the respect in the seniors of today?














1. Are you a current member?


1.a If so, what type?


1.c If you were a member, why did you leave?


2. How long have you been a member?


3. Do you think the Golf Membership Fee is fair?


5. What do you enjoy most about playing the course?


